

NOTICE TO PREGNANT WOMEN

HOW TO APPLY FOR PREGNANCY MEDICAID

There are two (2) ways pregnant women can apply for Medicaid in Broward County:

PRESUMPTIVE ELIGIBILITY FOR PREGNANT WOMEN (PEPW): Undocumented, non U.S. citizens, or women in a non-qualifying immigration status may be eligible for temporary, outpatient Medicaid coverage for up to two months to help cover a portion their prenatal care. PEPW does not cover the birth of the baby.

1). To apply for PEPW in person: Call ahead to schedule an appointment at one of the five locations listed below to complete the PEPW application and begin prenatal care. Please note that if you apply for Medicaid coverage at one of these sites, this is where you may continue to receive your prenatal care. After your PEPW application is approved, you must complete a regular Medicaid application online to determine your eligibility for continued coverage past the maximum of 60 days of prenatal care covered by PEPW. See instructions under #2 below for more information.

2). To apply for Medicaid using the online electronic application: Visit the Department of Children and Families (DCF) ACCESS Self-Service Portal website <http://www.myflorida.com/accessflorida/> and click ‘Apply for Benefits’. Follow the instructions to apply for Medicaid and be sure to click the box within the application to indicate you are pregnant. You may also choose to apply for other ACCESS benefits at the same time. Please see the document labeled *Documents Required Medicaid Approval During Pregnancy* to identify the documents required by DCF to process your application which can be mailed or faxed to DCF as indicated in the box below.
